### Vocabulary

Pick five (5) words from the reading passage that you were unfamiliar with. Look up these words, get a good understanding of the words and create a picture, scene, or visual representation of the words.

### Comic Strip

Create at least three (3) frames of a comic strip showing a key scene or theme in the book. Be sure to include dialogue bubbles. Try Make Beliefs Comix:

### Who Am I Riddle

Using a riddle format, create a list of 5-7 riddle facts that would describe a character or a person in history about whom you have read. Your riddle facts should show an understanding of character/person.

Examples: I have a scar on my forehead that I got from my enemy. I use a wand to cast spells. My best friend is part giant.

### Time Capsule

Create a time capsule. Put yourself in the character's shoes and ask yourself what he/she would like future generations to learn about them. Choose objects that represent important information about the character. Then write a brief paragraph explaining why you included each object. Decorate a baggie to represent the character and store the objects and description inside.

### Point of View

Rewrite a key event from the plot in a different point of view.

### Figurative Language

#### Power Point
